About the Henry and William Williams Memorial Trust

The Henry and Williams Memorial Trust is an Anglican Charitable Trust. It was established by Archdeacon Samuel Williams of Te Aute, to honour the memory of his father Henry and his uncle William, who were missionaries among the Maori people of Aotearoa, New Zealand from 1823 -1876. The Trustees of this Trust are all descendants of Henry & Marianne Williams and/or William and Jane Williams.

The purpose of the Trust is to support Christian missionary work based on Anglican principles, among indigenous peoples of Aotearoa New Zealand, the Pacific Islands and other countries.

This includes:

- Supporting existing missions
- Establishing new missions
- Specific health, education, welfare, and other mission projects
- Education of suitable candidates for missionary work
- Anglican mission support
